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### About this release

Quest NetVault Backup (NetVault Backup) Plug-in *for SAP on Oracle* (Plug-in *for SAP on Oracle*) 11.4.5 is a minor release, with enhanced features and functionality. ### **Known issues**

The following is a list of issues, including issues attributed to third-party products, known to exist at the time of release.

The plug-in currently sends the backup's saveset ID to <b>brbackup</b> to identify the saveset that	DNSP-26

corresponding ID assigned to it. The copy sent to the secondary media has a new saveset ID,

Table 2. Third-party known issues

Known issue	Issue ID
Solaris (SPARC):	DNSP-14
If you use the <b>Target Client</b> tab to restore data to a third machine, check that the following conditions are met:	(16662, SBG-27)
<ul> <li>The target Client machine must be running the same operating system (OS) as the machine on which the original backup was made from.</li> </ul>	
<ul> <li>The target Client machine must be running the same version of the plug-in.</li> </ul>	
Inaccurately specifying the target Client could result in data being restored to the wrong machine	<b>)</b> .

#### IBM AIX:

- · Function of **Device** option in Backint parameter file.
- The plug-in does not handle sparse files as sparse. Restoring files causes sparse files to be restored as non-sparse.
- The plug-in does not operate through firewalls.
- After an evaluation license expires, the plug-in does not indicate that it is not licensed in the **About** dialog box.
- Physically removing a device during a Backint backup does not cause the job to fail.

# System requirements

Before installing Plug-in for SAP on Oracle 11.4.5, ensure that your system meets the requirements outlined in the Quest NetVault Backup Compatibility Guide available at https://support.quest.com/technical-documents.

**i IMPORTANT:** The plug-in was certified for integration with SAP NetWeaver through SAP integration scenario BC-BRI 720. Certification was conducted with SAP on Oracle.

## Upgrade and compatibility

Plug-in for SAP on Oracle 11.4.5 requires NetVault Backup 10.0 or later. For complete supported-platform information, see the Quest NetVault Backup Compatibility Guide.

## **Product licensing**

To obtain the license key for your NetVault Backup Server environment, determine the NetVault Machine ID of your main NetVault Backup Server. Also identify the machine IDs of any clients running application plug-ins, such as Oracle, MySQL, PostgreSQL, SQL Server, and Exchange.

You can use the NetVault Configuration Wizard to install the product license keys. Alternatively, you can install the license keys from the Manage Clients page.

## Obtaining a machine ID

- 1 Start the NetVault Backup WebUI.
- 2 In the Navigation pane, click Manage Clients.
- 3 In the NetVault Backup Clients list, select the applicable machine, and click Manage.
- 4 On the View Client page, note the machine ID exactly as it is displayed in the Client Summary table.

# Installing a license key using the configuration wizard

- 1 In the Navigation pane, click Guided Configuration.
- 2 On the NetVault Configuration Wizard page, click Install Licenses.
- 3 In the NetVault Backup Clients list, select the applicable machine, and click Next.
- 4 In the **Enter the license key string** box, type or copy and paste the license key, and click **Apply**. After the key is applied successfully, a message is displayed.

# Installing a license key from the Manage Clients page

- 1 In the Navigation pane, click Manage Clients.
- 2 In the NetVault Backup Clients list, select the applicable machine, and click Manage.
- 3 On the View Client page, click Install License.
- 4 In the Install License dialog box, type or copy and paste the license key, and click Apply.
  After the key is applied successfully, a message is displayed.
- 5 To dismiss the dialog box, click **Close**.

# Upgrade and installation instructions

**Upgrading from 4.x or earlier is not supported.** If you have an existing installation and you might need to restore associated data using the previous version, archive the applicable machine with the existing plug-in and associated data. After you have archived the preceding components, remove the existing plug-in and install the new version. Alternatively, you can install NetVault Backup 8.6.1 (or later) and the Plug-in *for SAP on Oracle* 11.4.5 on a new machine, and run both machines until the earlier machine can be retired. (3140)

**IMPORTANT:** The plug-in *must exist* on the NetVault Backup Server, regardless of the configuration in use. If you are using the recommended Client/Server configuration, complete this process on the SAP Backint Server machine and then repeat the process on the NetVault Backup Server.
